## Join an Industry Committee

Link into a network of approximately 800 employers and employees across Alberta who are working together to influence virtually every aspect of their trade or occupation from course content to certification standards.

### Local Apprenticeship Committees (LAC)

Local apprenticeship committees stay in touch with activities in their trade. They suggest improvements and make recommendations to the trade's provincial apprenticeship committee.

Local apprenticeship committees provide provincial apprenticeship committees with recommendations about issues facing apprentices, journeypersons and employers. Their ongoing contributions ensure that a trade continues to grow and adapt to industry's needs.

### Provincial Apprenticeship Committees (PAC)

Provincial apprenticeship committees are the link between local apprenticeship committees and the Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Board. Committee members represent the interests of employers and employees across industry and regions.

Based on the suggestions from local apprenticeship committees, provincial apprenticeship committees make recommendations to the Board on how to modify and enhance apprenticeship training and certification.

### Occupational Committees

Occupational committees recommend competency and certification standards in designated occupations to the Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Board.

### Committee Successes

#### Winning Time

Realizing the pressure put on a small shop because of an eight-week technical training absence for an apprentice, members of a local apprenticeship committee suggested once-a-week training. Thanks to the committee's suggestion the apprentice received the required training, and the shop was only short-staffed for a small portion of the week.

#### Speed of Change

Due to the speed of technological change in their industry, members of a provincial apprenticeship committee were concerned about training manuals being quickly outdated. The committee's suggestions for improvements led to the creation of individualized and up-to-date learning materials.
