If you need help completing this form, in Alberta call 310-0000 and ask to be connected toll free to your nearest Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training (AIT) office (as listed on page 4). Outside of Alberta, contact any Alberta AIT office directly.

All applications, when completed and signed by the applicant and the employer, are to be sent to the nearest Alberta AIT office. Incomplete applications and applications missing the required non-refundable fee, transcripts or documents will be returned to the applicant. Only when the application is returned to the Alberta AIT office complete will it be processed.

You can apply to attempt a Prior Learning Assessment examination if you want to determine your level of skill and knowledge for any of the following purposes:

- entry into an apprenticeship program
- advanced standing in an apprenticeship program based on Provincial Apprenticeship Committee accredited training
- advanced standing in an apprenticeship program based on previous work experience or training in a trade

If you want to learn a trade, you must be an apprentice. You must have an employer who is willing to sign a contract of apprenticeship with you and who is able to provide you with supervision and training.

About Prior Learning Assessments

Entrance Examination

If you are interested in becoming an apprentice but you are not able to provide documentation showing that you have the educational requirements of the trade, or if you are required to successfully complete an entrance exam in your chosen trade, you may apply to attempt an entrance examination.

- Fill out sections **1, 2, and 6** of the application form.
- There is no fee for an entrance examination.

Pre-employment Programs

If you are registered in a pre-employment program accredited by the Provincial Apprenticeship Committee at an Alberta educational institution, you may apply to attempt a prior learning assessment examination.

- Fill out sections **1, 2, 3, 5, and 6** of the application form.
- Pay the required prior learning assessment non-refundable fee. (See the fee information on pages 10 - 12.)

When you successfully complete your pre-employment program, and you have the educational requirements or have passed the entrance exam for the trade, Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training will administer the prior learning examination for the 1st period of the apprenticeship program.

Alberta High School Vocational Graduate/Undergraduate or Career and Technology Studies (CTS) Programs

If you have the educational requirements or have passed the entrance exam for a trade, and have successfully completed the required courses in a Vocational Graduate/Undergraduate Program or Career and Technology Studies (CTS) Program that has been accredited by the Provincial Apprenticeship Committee, you may attempt prior learning assessment examinations for advanced standing in an apprenticeship program.

- Fill out sections **1, 2, 3, and 6** of the application form.
- Submit the original or a **certified true copy*** of an official transcript of your high school marks (See the instructions for obtaining an official transcript on page 6.)
- For CTS students, submit the record of courses completed, which must be signed by the teacher responsible for the CTS program.

If you apply for a prior learning assessment within 3 years of the date you completed these courses, there is no fee for the examination.

If you apply more than 3 years after you completed these courses, you must:

- pay the required prior learning assessment non-refundable fee. (See the fee information on pages 10 - 12.)
- fill out section 6 of the application form.

The courses you completed may allow you to attempt the prior learning assessment examination for more than one period of the apprenticeship program. If this is the case, after you have successfully completed the 1st period exam, you will be notified to attempt the exam for the next period. There is a fee for each period exam you write.

If you are not sure your courses are accredited by the Provincial Apprenticeship Committee, contact the nearest Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training office. The office addresses and phone numbers are on page 4.

Alberta Technician and Technology Programs

If you have successfully completed the required courses in a technician or technology program that has been accredited by the Provincial Apprenticeship Committee, you may attempt prior learning assessment examinations for advanced standing in an apprenticeship program.

- Fill out sections **1, 2, 3, 5, and 6** of the application form.
- If you have completed your training program, submit the original or a **certified true copy*** of your certificate or diploma.
- If you have not yet completed your training program, submit the original or a **certified true copy*** of an official transcript of your course marks from the educational institution that is delivering the program.
- Pay the required prior learning assessment non-refundable fee. (See the fee information on pages 10 - 12.)

A certified true copy is certified to be an exact copy of the original. A lawyer or notary public can do this for you.

About Prior Learning Assessments (cont'd)

If you are not sure your program is accredited by the Provincial Apprenticeship Committee, contact the nearest Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training office (as listed on page 4).

Previous Work Experience or Training in the Trade

If you have the educational requirements or have passed the required entrance exam, and you have a minimum of 1 year of work experience in the trade **or** have successfully completed training that covers the same objectives identified in the Alberta Apprenticeship Course Outline for the trade, you may apply for a prior learning assessment to determine the credit you will be granted for advanced standing in an apprenticeship program.

- Fill out sections **1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6** of the application form.
- Submit the original or a **certified true copy*** (see definition page 3) of an official transcript of your high school marks (See the instructions for obtaining an official transcript on page 6.) If you cannot provide a high school transcript, you will be required to complete the entrance exam for the trade.
- Submit proof that you have the required work experience or training.
- Pay the required prior learning assessment non-refundable fee. (See the fee information on pages 10 - 12.)

If you have enough previous work experience to be eligible to attempt a prior learning assessment examination for more than one period of the apprenticeship program, you will be required to pay the prior learning assessment fee(s) for each period exam that you attempt.

Note: To receive an Alberta Journeyman Certificate you must complete at least 12 months in an apprenticeship program. This includes successfully completing one period of technical training, accumulating the minimum number of on-the-job training hours, and passing all required examinations.

Examinations

In all trades, you must pass a written theory exam. Some trades also require that you pass a practical exam. The pass mark for all examinations (theory or practical) is 70%.

The theory exam may be written at any Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training office (as listed on page 4). The practical examination may only be available at certain locations.

Approval of Prior Learning Assessment application confirms ONE attempt at the theory examination and ONE attempt at the practical examination, if applicable (practical exam fee(s) apply).

You will be notified of your results by mail. Within 30 days of receiving your results, you may apply in writing for a review of the results of your examination.

Fees

In addition to covering the costs of reviewing the application and verifying your work experience (if applicable), the original assessment fee(s), if required, covers ONE attempt at the theory examination. If a second attempt is required and approved, a rewrite fee is payable before scheduling of the exam can be completed.

In trades where a practical exam is required, there is an additional fee(s) for each attempt. This fee(s) covers the cost of the exam, materials and markers. The fee for the practical exam varies from trade to trade and period to period because of the difference in cost of materials. **Fees are subject to change without notice.** Contact an Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training office (as listed on page 4) for more information. **Fees are non-refundable.**

Cancellation of an Application

Your application will be cancelled if you:

- do not have the requirements to qualify
- fail the examination twice
- do not pay the reattempt or practical examination fee(s) if required within 30 days from the date of notification
- do not attempt the scheduled examination(s) and do not notify Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training.

Subject to AIT approval and payment of applicable fee(s) by the applicant, this application permits the applicant ONE attempt at the theory exam. Any re-attempt of the theory exam or attempt of the practical exam (if applicable) is also subject to AIT approval and payment of each exam's fees by the applicant. If the application is cancelled, contact an AIT office to discuss the options available. Fees are non-refundable.

You must make every effort to obtain the required letters or Confirmation of Work Experience forms from your employer(s).
