
Ladies and Gentlemen:

Ladies and Gentlemen:

I am writing on behalf of the Alberta Apprenticeship and Industry Training Board to advise you of the actions the board has taken to ensure that it complies with the obligations of the British Columbia – Alberta *Trade, Investment and Labour Mobility Agreement* (TILMA) as it relates to the trades and occupations designated under Alberta's *Apprenticeship and Industry Training Act*.

As you are aware, under the TILMA, workers who are certified for a given occupation in one province must be recognized as qualified to work in that occupation in the other province and workers who are certified to work in a trade under the Interprovincial Standards Red Seal Program (Red Seal Program) must be recognized as qualified to work in that trade in both provinces.

To comply with the TILMA, the board has recognized certain certificates issued by British Columbia that it had not previously recognized. These include:

- certificates without a red seal in red seal trades issued after the establishment of the Red Seal Program in that trade, and
- certificates in non-red-seal trades in which both provinces issue certificates (e.g. British Columbia tower crane operator [Alberta crane and hoisting equipment operator – tower crane]).

The board previously recognized a number of certificates or documents. These were:

- certificates bearing an Interprovincial Standards Red Seal in a trade or occupation that in Alberta is a designated trade or occupation,
- completion of apprenticeship certificates in red seal trades issued before the establishment of the Red Seal Program in that trade,
- certain certificates in non-red seal trades, such as completion of apprenticeship certificates and other certificates that had been recognized by the board on the recommendation of the provincial apprenticeship committee (e.g. British Columbia automotive refinishing prep technician certificate [Alberta auto body – prepper]).

The board is authorized, under section 3 of the *Apprenticeship and Industry Training Act*, to make orders recognizing certificates as being equivalent to a trade certificate granted under the Act. On February 6, 2009, the board approved the *Certification and Certificate Recognition Order*, Board Order 2/2009 recognizing the certificates described on page one that it had not already recognized. Holders of recognized certificates are not required to obtain an Alberta certificate or document.

The *Certification and Certificate Recognition Order* has been posted on the on the apprenticeship and industry training website, www.tradesecrets.gov.ab.ca. The certificates that are recognized are identified in the appendices to this letter. The board has asked Alberta Advanced Education and Technology to post the information in the appendices on both the www.tradesecrets.gov.ab.ca and www.tilma.ca websites.

The board will comply with the obligations of the TILMA, as revised from time to time and looks forward to continued cooperation with your organizations.
